Sandhurst Adult Faith Education & Spirituality Weekend

Time for reflection and prayer, celebration of Eucharist, experiences of friendships and vibrant community and time for relaxation are all part of this weekend. Sandhurst Diocesan Pilgrimage

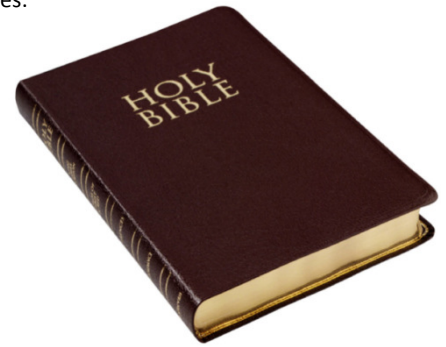

'Foundations' - Certificate IV in Christian Ministry & Theology

Offered by the Institute of Faith Education Brisbane (<http://ife.qld.edu.au>) in the Sandhurst Diocese

The NEW *Foundations* is a **one year** Open Learning Online course of individual study, exploring six themes:

1. The God of the Old Testament
2. Jesus the Christ: Exploring the New Testament
3. Catholic Beliefs: Theology for Today
4. People of God: The Church Then and Now
5. Sacraments & Liturgy
6. Living Integrity: Ethics and Catholic Social Teaching



It is designed to enable students to –

- Gain faith understanding and 1st level qualifications for a variety of vocational pathways.
 - Complete the course within one year
 - Access Use-Friendly Learning Resources On – Line
 - Learn at your own pace, in your own unique style, supported by Course Coordinators and Education Officers providing advice and guidance
 - Become confident in talking about faith by gaining a sound understanding of current Catholic theology
 - Gain practical skills
 - Achieve a nationally recognised Certificate IV in Christian Ministry & Theology
- With affordable course costs

Open Learning

As a *Foundations* student you are provided with structured learning materials and assessment tasks including practical projects and brief short answer tasks which can be tailored to your own context, providing lots of choice. Learn at your own pace and submit assessment items via email. Receive feedback and support throughout the course from your Assessor. 'Phone support is available from the Education and Students Support Officers of IFE. Sandhurst participants may choose, if they wish, to have a Sandhurst mentor and / or to be put in touch other students for discussion and mutual support.
