REV. FR. EDWARD HARTE

Born on the 13th of March 1933 in Warrnambool, Victoria, the sixth of eight children to Harold and Elsie Harte. Fr Ted went to the State Primary School in Allansford; won a scholarship to, and attended, Technical School Warrnambool; and studied Latin at Assumption College Kilmore. Before he began his studies at Corpus Christi College, he worked with the National Bank and the Department of Civil Aviation.

He was ordained by Bishop Stewart at St Brendan's Church, Shepparton, on Saturday, July 23rd 1966 at the age of 33. Fr Ted served at St Patrick's Wangaratta 1967-1973, St Brendan's Shepparton 1973-1980 and as Parish Priest of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Parish, White Hills 1980-2017. In 1999 and 2001 Fr Harte served for several months as an assistant priest at St John The Evangelist Parish, New York where he said; 'saying Mass in the basement of a nineteen floor skyscraper in New York was just the same as saying Mass in White Hills'.

He served in many hospital chaplaincies with care and compassion, was a distinguished patron, committee member and life member of the Marong Racing Club and Chaplain to the Bendigo Jockey Club - along with an uncanny ability to pick a winner!

Awarded the Order of Australia Medal for services to the Catholic Church and the Community on Australia Day 2018. Fr Edward Joseph Harte died at Mercy Health Bethlehem Home for the Aged on Sunday 2nd January 2022 aged 88.
