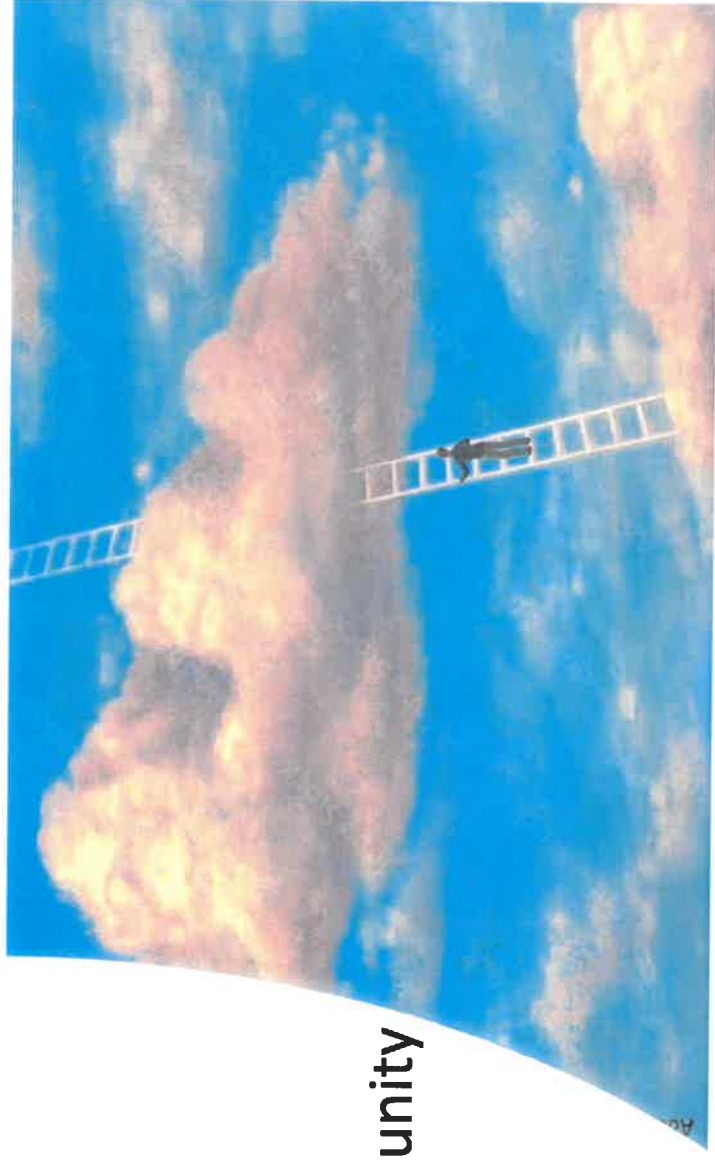


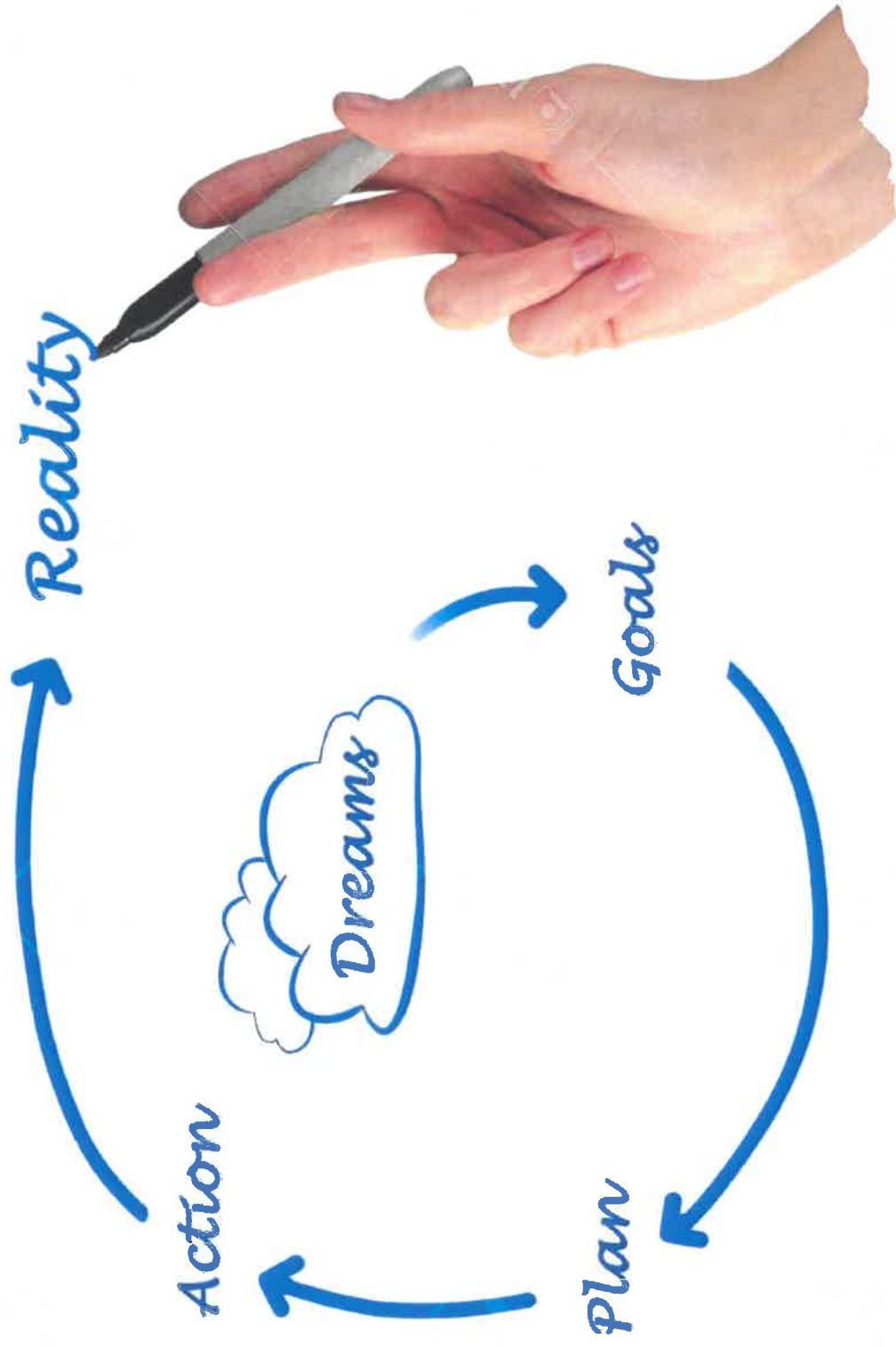

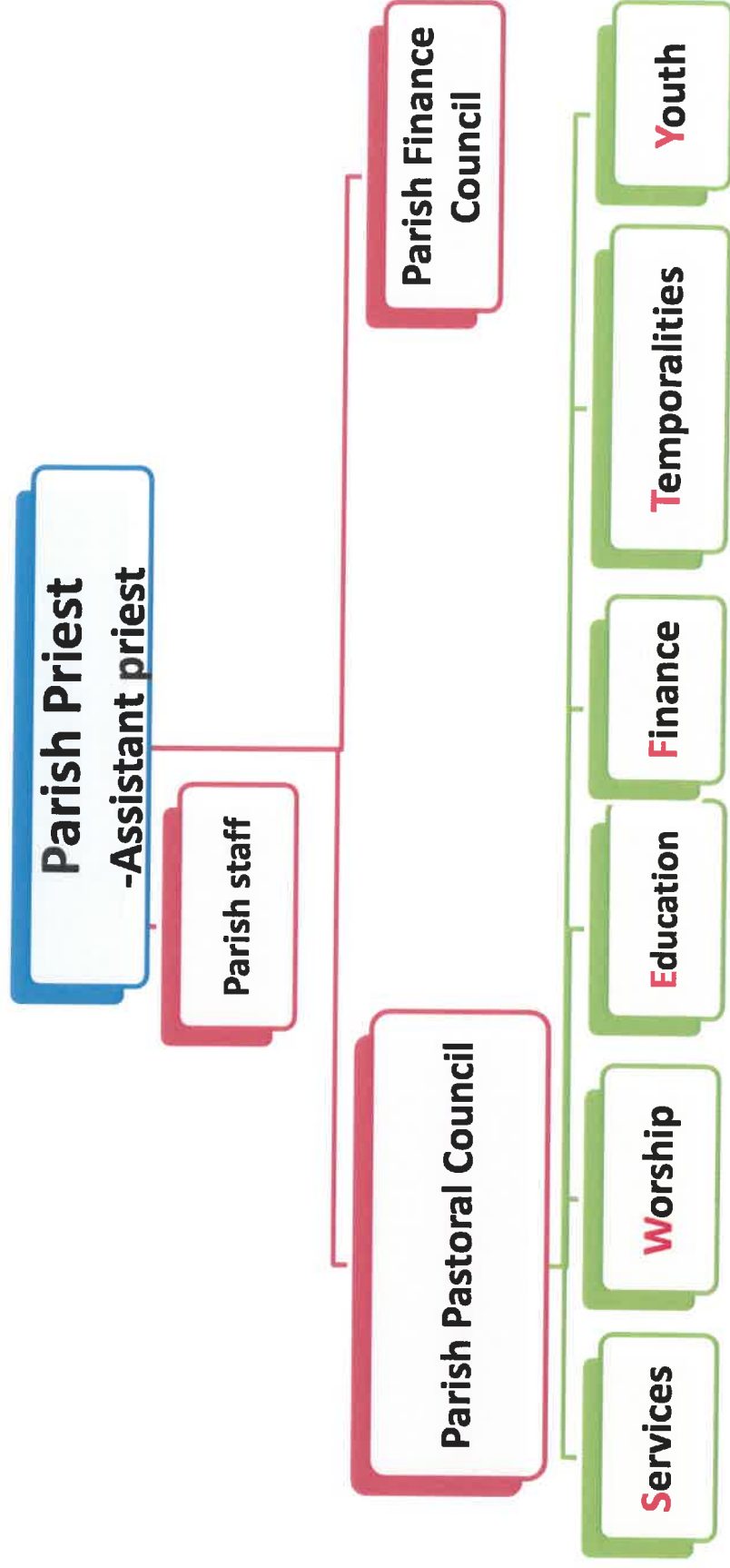

Year 1 - Survey community needs, form service committee.



Year 2 - Outreach programs (scholarships), collaborate with local organizations.



Year 3 - Volunteer roles, annual recognition events.



Year 4 - Evaluate programs, expand partnerships.

Worship and Liturgy



Year 1: Conduct a liturgical review, establish diverse sub-committees, initiate training, introduce multicultural liturgies.



Year 2: Vibrant music ministry, interactive homilies, education sessions, visual elements.



Year 3: Youth-led liturgies, collaboration with other parishes, Liturgy Fair.



Year 4: Evaluate innovations, create handbooks, celebrate inclusive worship.



Education (Formation)

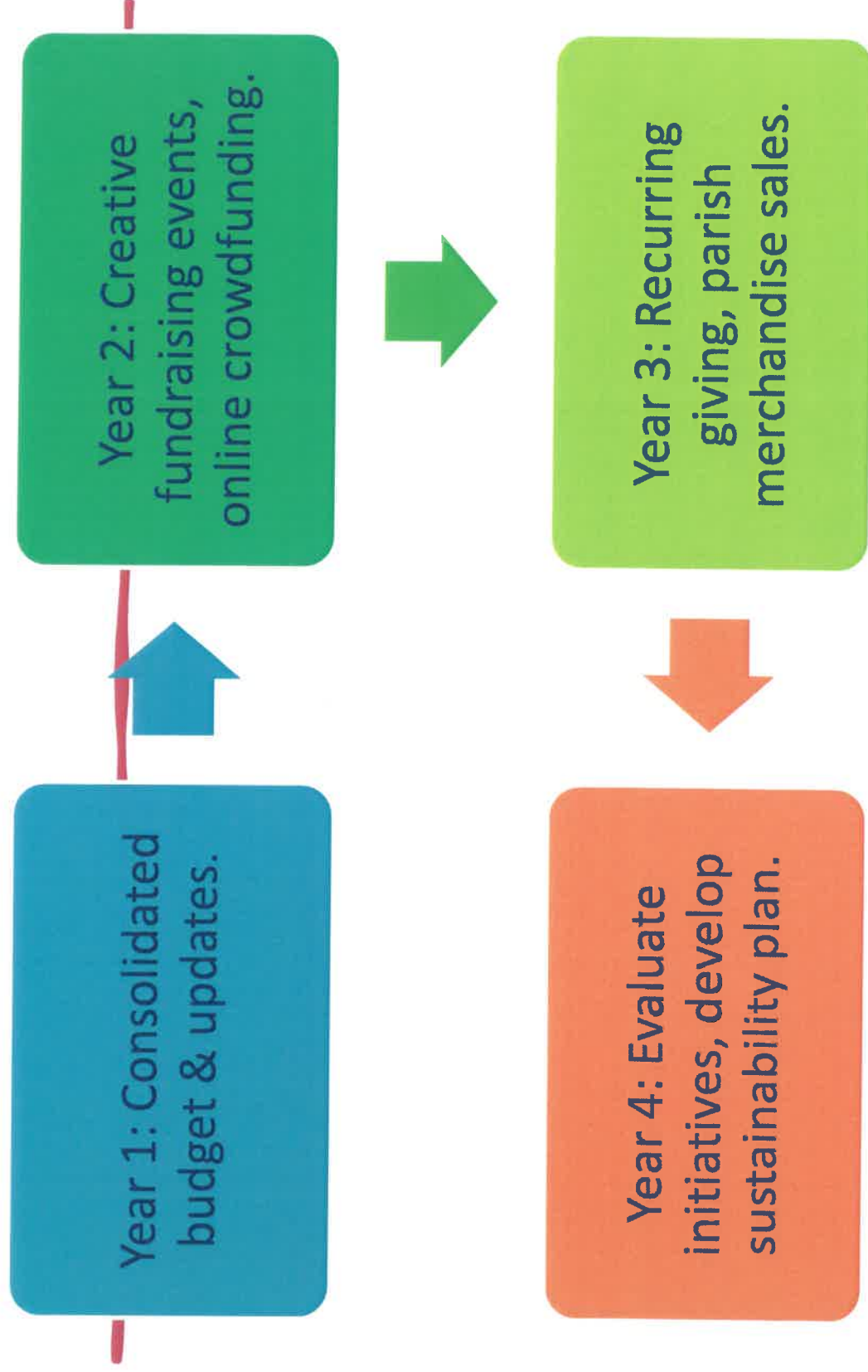
Year 1: Needs assessment, establish committee, intergenerational sessions

Year 1: Property Inventory, address safety issues. Building planning and development

Year 2: upgrades, open spaces for income generation. Parking area improvements, security, gathering space

Year 3: Green initiatives, community gardens.

Year 4: Maintenance schedule, long-term upgrades.

Year 1: Youth council, youth-led events.

Year 2: Leadership/spirituality workshops, use technology to engage.

Parish Finance Council



Canon 537 of the Catholic Church requires that every parish have a parish finance council (PFC). The PFC helps the parish priest manage the parish's finances and property.

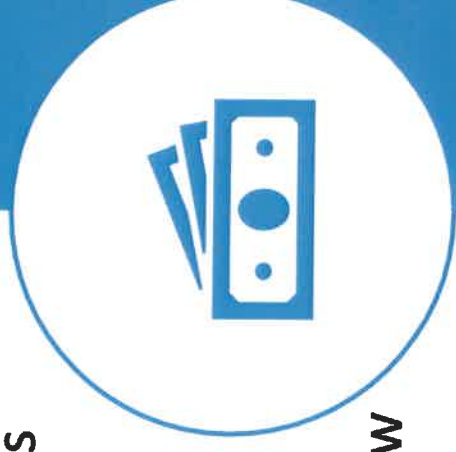


Purpose: The PFC provides advice and insight to the parish priest; helps the parish priest act in the best interests of the parish.



Membership: The PFC is made up of members of the faithful with expertise in financial affairs and civil law; known for their integrity and love for the Church.

Responsibilities: prepares budgets for the coming year; monitors income and expenditures against the budget; publishes annual accounts to the parish; keeps minutes of meetings; ensures that books of accounts are kept in accordance with Diocesan procedures.



Governance: The PFC is ruled by universal law and the norms set by the diocesan Bishop.

The parish priest presides over the PFC.
